## Physiotherapy Private Practice

At this time, the Public Health Protection measures restricting gatherings and closing businesses do not apply to health-care facilities. Therefore, physiotherapy clinics and multidisciplinary practices remain open for business at their owner's discretion.

NLCP is cognizant of the concerns regarding the spread of COVID-19 and recommendations from public health officials. We are monitoring new developments closely. We are also cognizant that for many patients their physiotherapy care is essential to their health, well-being, and ability to function.

The Government of Newfoundland and Labrador has the sole authority to declare if health-care facilities such as physiotherapy clinics must close. The NLCP is taking our lead from the experts in public health and recognize their knowledge and expertise in this area.
